FUNDRAISING ACHIEVEMENTS

A note from Cathleen Niedermayer, '59

LOOK WHAT YOUR DUES AND SUPPORT OF FUND-RAISERS CAN ACCOMPLISH!

In the last issue of PRIMES, I reported that the Association was sending financial support of \$860.00 to Sister Mary Varghese rscj in PATNA, INDIA to help defray school costs for 6 of her poorest female students who would not otherwise have uniforms or supplies. The girls are very appreciative of this help. This is a three year commitment and the time is now upon us when another cheque needs to be sent to help for this year. This is a tremendous commitment on behalf of the Association and fund-raising has helped, BUT WE ARE IN NEED OF MORE MONEY TO KEEP THIS GOING. The biggest help would be for MORE MEMBERS TO SEND IN THEIR DUES so that this type of help could be continued when the need is so great. Here is some of what Sister Varghese says in her latest letter:

"In August the school celebrated "School Day" with much enthusiasm. The kids prepared a short entertainment with songs, dance and action songs in Hindi and in English. Every child was given a notebook, pencil, rubber (eraser) and a packet of biscuits. We observe that more activities and small gifts give them incentives to be more regular in attending class and in performance too. At the end of August, with the co-operation and generosity of the school director, we were able to provide a meal for them. We held a few sport activities for them in November. We distributed crayons, notebooks, pencils, rubbers, rulers, hair bands for girls, and pieces of soap as prizes. Older children got pens and note books.

In September the children were given oral and written tests to mark their progress in attendance and studies. The teachers noticed a marked improvement and enthusiasm in children on all fronts. Once in two weeks the children receive special value education classes where they discuss their domestic problems and get guidance to help them cope with life. Some of the older children offered good encouraging suggestions in class."

In addition to our commitment in India, the Association also continues to send \$500.00 each year to pay the school fees for ANGELLAH NSAABIMANA in UGANDA. Sister Margie Conroy rscj sends us regular reports to keep us informed about Angellah's excellent progress at school.
